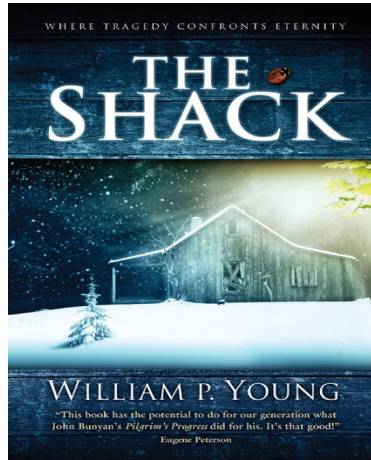


# **The Shack**      Recommended by Mr Poon
